Tips for Using LockDown Browser

Here we compile a short list of different ways you can incorporate the use of LockDown Browser to your course's quizzes, additional proctoring support, and alternatives for students unable to install LDB.

A. Examples of Using LockDown Browser Effectively

- In-person Canvas Quiz with LockDown Browser

- Note: LockDown Browser is already installed in Forestry undergraduate labs.

B. Additional Proctoring Support with Zoom

- In conjunction with LDB, Zoom can be used to monitor progress or provide a communication channel during assessments.
- Zoom's All Screens mode allows the host to request participants share their entire desktop, providing a scrollable side-by-side view of both the student's video and their shared screen. This creates a more streamlined and effective proctoring setup. Zoom All Screen Mode instructions can be accessed [here](#).

C. Alternative Options for Students Unable to Install LDB

- Online Canvas Quiz (without LDB) + Zoom monitoring
- In-person Canvas Quiz (without LDB) with invigilation
